Annabel Simms picks out 13 small museums in France that are well worth a visit. In the North there are the Musée de L'Hospice Comtesse in Lille, the Maison de Jules Verne in Amiens Musée de la Verrerie in Blagny sur Bresle and the Musée Flaubert et d'histoire de la médecine in Rouen. Around the outskirts of Paris are the Musée du Jouet in Poissy and the Musée de la Préhistoire dile de France in Nemours, whilst in Moulins in the centre of France is the Triptyque du Maître de Moulins. Moving south are the Horreum in Narbonne, the Atelier Cezanne in Aix-en-Provence, Villa Kerylos in Beaulieu-sur-Mer, the Musée Escoffier de l'Art Culinaire in Villeneuve-Loubet, the Chapelle du Rosaire in Vence and the Musée Jean Cocteau in Menton.
